

There is one true God, eternally existing in three Divine yet distinct persons – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – each of whom possesses equally the same attributes of Deity and the characteristics of personality. (John 14:6-7, Matt. 28:19)

He was resurrected in the same physical body, though glorified, in which He lived and died. (1 Cor. 15:4)

Man's nature is corrupted, and we are unable to please God. Every man is in need of salvation by grace through faith in Jesus and renewal by the Holy Spirit in order to enter the Kingdom. (Rom. 3:23-24, Eph. 2:8-9)

Jesus will come again to earth – personally, visibly and bodily – to consummate history and the eternal plan of God. (Rev. 22:12-13)
